



- 1) Create a spreadsheet with 3 columns. 1<sup>st</sup> column is the keywords, 2<sup>nd</sup> column is global month search volume, 3<sup>rd</sup> column is the rankings.
- 2) You can do the vlookup tip for the 3<sup>rd</sup> column if you want. If you don't, that fine.
- 3) Highlight all the columns with your data in currently then click the "insert" tab on the navigation menu on the top of Excel.
- 4) On the leftmost side, there is a button called Pivot Table. Select "Pivot Chart"




5) It will ask you where you want to save it. Just save it in the same workbook in a different sheet. I saved mine in Sheet 4 so it looks like this:



6) It will bring you to this weird looking empty table:




7) Ignore everything. Just make sure you tick all the boxes under the Field List and drag and drop them as follows:



8) Immediately a bar chart appears:



9) Highlight the column where your monthly searches is in here. Then, select "Data" on navigational menu on excel and sort by Z/A





10) Then click on the chart itself. Navigate your mouse to "Format" under the navigational menu




and make sure you select "Sum of your rankings" in here. Then click "Format Selection".


11) This will pop up. Make sure you select "Secondary Axis" option:



12) Now right click on the vertical axis that is your Rankings Axis (NOT Search Volume Axis)






Make sure you click "Format Axis" in the right click menu that pops up:

13) In the pop up that comes up, tick "Values in Reverse Order"



14) Next click on the columns in the chart that represents your rankings. They should automatically be selected. Then right click and select "Change Series Chart Type":


